Uniform

While school clubs are running, we ask that your children only play in the play equipment area, cones will be in place.

Parent Induction Evening Monday 11th September

On Monday, we will be holding an Induction Meeting for all parents from Nursery to Year 6. This year the meetings will take place face to face. In addition, the meetings will be recorded for parents who are unable to attend. This is a very important meeting to access, as it will give you the opportunity to meet your child's new teacher, hear about their new working environment and some of the resources they will be using. Your child's teacher will talk about the programme of study and how we can work together to ensure the best outcomes.

You will have three times to choose from, so that you can join all your children's meetings, if you wish to attend in person. In our experience, children are most successful when we all work in

partnership with each other. As parents you are a big part of their educational journey and it is vital you understand how they learn and your role as parents.
