Junior History Society

The theme of our Junior History Society meeting this half term was, 'Why should the Ancient Egyptians be remembered?'. During the session, we investigated Ancient Egyptian artefacts and used the artefacts to discover more about the ways in which the Ancient Egyptians lived. The children made a prediction about the purpose of each artefact, before we discovered their true purposes. We then debated the significance of each of the artefacts.

The children were given a range of inventions and had to decide in their groups whether the inventions were made by the Ancient Egyptians, or during another historical period. We had such fun considering each invention and trying to work out their origin. Our favourite discoveries were the Ancient Egyptians inventing the toothbrush and bowling!

We also enjoyed listening to research that children had done themselves about the Ancient Egyptians. Each child was also given a papyrus bookmark as a Junior History souvenir. We are looking forward to welcoming new members to our next meeting in the Spring term, when we will be considering the reasons behind the decline of the Ancient Egyptians.

Year 1 Victorian Toy Day

We played parlour games, including 'charades' and 'squeak piggy squeak'. We spent time exploring everyday household objects and toys from the past. We played a listening game that allowed us to identify some of the jobs that children might have done such as chimney sweep, selling bunches of lavender, selling roasted chestnuts or going down the mines.
