The children researched the last Ancient Egyptian monarch - Queen Cleopatra VII. They used different historical resources to draw their own conclusions about Cleopatra and the type of Queen she was. The children enjoyed finding out about Cleopatra's life and how the Ancient Egyptian period came to an end with her death.

We are looking forward to welcoming even more new members to our next meeting in the Summer term, when we will be investigating the life and influence of John Lennon.

Year 3 Stone Age to Iron Age Workshop

On Thursday, Year 3 had the most amazing day participating in a Stone Age to Iron Age workshop in school. The children helped Emit, who had been trapped inside a computer game, to complete his mission by carrying out different tasks to complete three levels: the Stone Age, the Bronze Age and the Iron Age. Whilst in the Stone Age level, the class had the opportunity to handle tools from this period, which helped to bring their learning to life. They learned that the foods eaten were either gathered like berries, farmed like sheep and wheat or hunted like elkes. During the Bronze Age level, the children constructed a roundhouse and experienced what life was like living in one. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed this, especially creating wattle and daub and sitting around the fire. Having completed the Stone Age and Bronze Age levels, the children had one final part to their mission on the Iron Age level. Here, the children visited an 'Iron Age market' to choose a present for the chief of the tribe. There was a jewellery stall that sold torcs, a food stall that sold the fattiest and yummiest of pigs and a wool stall that sold the prettiest of loom weights. The chief was very impressed with his gifts and granted that some trees could be cut down. Our mission drew to a close following some questions and answers about the three periods visited. Year 3 were brilliant and with their help Emit completed his mission.

Leave of Absence Information

Please read the information below which is a reminder that holidays will not be authorised during term time and a leave of absence only agreed in exceptional circumstances.

Any application for leave must establish that there are exceptional circumstances and the Headteacher must be satisfied that the circumstances warrant the granting of leave. Headteachers will determine how many school days a child may be absent from school if the leave is granted.'

School Uniform Reminder

"Back to the App" Online Safety Performance/Workshop

On Tuesday, Altru Drama visited school to deliver an online safety drama performance to KS2. This performance helped the children to develop their knowledge and understanding about internet safety and the negative ways the internet can be used, including the consequences for themselves and others. Year 5 and 6 then participated in a follow up workshop to explore these themes further. It was a fun and enjoyable way for the children to learn about these important issues and how they can keep themselves safe online.

We will be running parents evening on Monday 26th February from 3.40pm – 6.00pm and Monday 4th March from 3.40pm - 6.00pm. The meetings will be virtual but you will have an opportunity to visit your child's classroom on Monday 18th March from 3.30pm until 5.30pm to have a look at their books and classroom environment.

Year 5 Space Theme Day

During Year 5's space theme day the children were tasked with safely landing an alien's egg from orbit. During the day the children were challenged to build a capsule or landing pad for an egg that needed to drop from orbit (3 metres). The children had to problem solve, use team work and think critically about their designs in order to decide on a final, effective plan which was then carried out in teams of 3. These landing devices were then tested outside, with nearly all of the groups delivering the egg safely to the ground.

The children also created their own stomp rocket, made entirely out of paper. This involved several intricate steps to create an airtight tube which could be launched into the air. The children's designs varied, with some having 3, 4 or even 5 fins whilst also having a wide variety of nose cones. At the end of the day, we launched our rockets and we found that all of the rockets were successful, blasting off across the hall.

Throughout the day, the children were exposed to rich scientific and engineering vocabulary to deepen their knowledge. There were also points where we discussed the enormity of our solar system using scale models and practical examples.
