
School Council

Year 2 trip to Warwick

On Wednesday, Year 2 went to Warwick on a class trip. We started off the day at the Market Hall Museum, where we were introduced to the Magic Story Box. We dressed up and used musical instruments to set the scene. We were going to go back in time to September 1694, when Lord Brooke was living in Warwick Castle. He had received several claims for compensation following the Great Fire of Warwick. Our task during the day was to find out more about each claimant and their compensation claim and then decide whether we thought compensation was needed and how much should be awarded.

We went on a walking tour of Warwick and discovered many locations that had been affected by the Great Fire. We learned about who lived at this location and how much they lost, our guide gave us photographs and props to help us to learn more about each claimant and their life. Some claimants lost nothing in the fire but were still asking for many hundreds of pounds in compensation! We had a fantastic day out and learned so much about the Great Fire of Warwick and how it affected the lives of many local people. We will now use this knowledge in our History lessons, to compare the fire of Warwick to the Great Fire of London. Mrs Bird Year 2 Class Teacher



Leave of Absence Information

Please read the information below which is a reminder that holidays will not be authorised during term time and a leave of absence only agreed in exceptional circumstances.

'Parents do not have any entitlement to take their children on holiday during term time. Any application for leave must establish that there are exceptional circumstances and the Headteacher must be satisfied that the circumstances warrant the granting of leave. Headteachers will determine how many school days a child may be absent from school if the leave is granted.'

School Uniform Reminder

School uniform is an important part of the identity of our school and is linked to our ethos and values, particularly one of equality and contributes to the behaviours and attitudes we want to see across our school. We do not expect children to wear uniform with our school logo, that is a personal choice. However, we do ask that your children wear our school colours of red tops / white polo shirts and grey/black trousers/skirts and wear comfortable and practical school shoes. Children should not wear nail varnish and if they have long hair, it should be tied back. Pupils are only permitted to wear small stud earrings and smart watches are not permitted in school.
