Year 2 Theme Day

The Stuarts

Today, Year 2 took part in a Knowledge Building Day about the Stuarts. We started the day by learning about the Stuart monarchs and the lengths of time that they ruled for. We then focused on Charles II as he was the monarch during the Great Fire of London in 1666.

We investigated the features of Stuart houses and had fun learning about the introduction of the Window Tax in 1696. We found out about why the Window Tax was introduced and how it affected people who lived in houses with lots of windows!

Finally, we enjoyed learning about the English Civil War. We used drama to represent the Cavaliers and the Roundheads and learnt more about who each group was supporting and why. We looked at the coat of arms of both Charles I and Oliver Cromwell and had great fun designing a coat of arms to represent each of us and our interests!

We had a great day learning about the Stuarts and the period of history that links to our Great Fire of London topic.

School Uniform Reminder

School uniform is an important part of the identity of our school and is linked to our ethos and values, particularly one of equality and contributes to the behaviours and attitudes we want to see across our school. We do not expect children to wear uniform with our school logo, that is a personal choice. However, we do ask that your children wear our school colours of red round neck sweatshirts/ white polo shirts and grey/black trousers/ skirts and wear comfortable and practical school shoes. Children should not wear nail varnish and if they have long hair, it should be tied back. Pupils are only permitted to wear small stud earrings and smart watches are not permitted in school.

A reminder that as part of our PE school uniform requirements, children should wear shorts, tops and tracksuits with our school logo, or plain school colours. They should not have branded items or the name of other clubs they attend out of school.

Coats, Hats and Gloves

A reminder to make sure that your child brings a coat to school every day, to ensure they are ready for our unpredictable weather. We also encourage pupils to bring hats and gloves so that they remain warm during break and lunchtime.

Leave of Absence Information

Please read the information below, which is a reminder that holidays will not be authorised during term time and a leave of absence only agreed in exceptional circumstances.

'Parents do not have any entitlement to take their children on holiday during term time. Any application for leave must establish that there are exceptional circumstances and the Headteacher must be satisfied that the circumstances warrant the granting of leave. Headteachers will determine how many school days a child may be absent from school if the leave is granted.'

Food Vouchers

We want to remind families that if you require help, you can contact the school to ask about food vouchers. Please get in touch if you need help. All enquiries we be dealt with in the strictest confidence.

Do you have a skill or knowledge to share?

To further develop the experiences for pupils and our links with our school community, we would like to find out if you or an adult member of your family has a skill or knowledge in a particular area which you would be able to share at school. Examples might include, sewing, a designer, author performer etc. If you feel you could share your skill/knowledge, please contact the school office.

Parking

<u>Please be respectful to residents on Headland Road by not parking or dropping off across their</u> <u>driveways.</u>

Parents are reminded that you must not park on or opposite the zig zags at any time during the school day, including clubs. **Please do not park across or block driveways or at road junctions**. We run an unofficial one-way system, so that all cars drive in from the Barton Road and leave via the church and ask that parents drive at 10mph. Your cooperation will ensure greater safety for all coming to and leaving school.

School Playing Field

Our school field will not be available while after school football clubs are running on Monday and Tuesday, in line with our safeguarding policy and the gate will to be locked at 4.30pm on Wednesday and Thursday.
