Sketchbook tasks

From Year One, pupils will be encouraged to keep sketch book journals for them to plan, record their observations and designs and explore different mediums and skills. They will be introduced to a greater range of materials (such as pencil, paint, charcoal and clay) to enable them to develop their techniques further.

The following scheme of work has been produced to develop skills, techniques and working methods as well as providing a record of individual skills progression across Key Stages 1 and 2. It works alongside the Long term Planning.

Using the task sheets

- Use art and design journals in accordance with the school policy.
- It is recommended that the task sheets are photocopied and kept alongside the children's artwork or displayed on the interactive whiteboard.
- All work must be dated using the presentation policy. This will provide a clear and easily accessible record of children's achievement and progression.
- Sketchbooks should be passed on to each new year group and key stage, not sent home.
- Some tasks have been repeated, such as portraits, to provide evidence for tracking progression of skills.
- Children will be encouraged to reflect on their own achievements; evaluating, reviewing and identifying progress.

Planning and assessment

Give children the opportunity to evaluate their own work as well as their peers; comparing ideas, methods and approaches, saying what they think and feel about their work.
