Alison Wright Visit - Disability Awareness Assembly and Workshops

School organised a Disability Awareness assembly and session today for Year 1 to Year 6. Alison Wright, from 'Accept, Listen & Learn', delivered workshops to KS1 and KS2. In KS1 Alison delivered a talk about exploring differences between us all and explained why she was born with short arms. She showed a video called 'It's ok to be different' and Alison also showed the children how she can use her feet to pick things up and draw a picture. KS2 had individual class sessions in the classrooms, where Alison explored with the children the different types of disabilities, including physical, sensory and hidden. She showed another short video and demonstrated her ability to use her feet. The purpose of Alison's visit was to promote understanding, empathy and inclusivity among our school community. We hope to foster and develop empathy and compassion towards individuals with disabilities, by promoting understanding of their challenges and experiences. Also, we wish to promote inclusivity, by encouraging a culture of acceptance, where we value everyone regardless of their abilities or differences. We hope to combat stigma and encourage supportive behaviours by equipping students with the knowledge and skills to interact respectfully. Overall, we hope today's visit from Alison raised awareness and served as an important educational opportunity to cultivate empathy and understanding, so as to build a more inclusive and compassionate society.

Leave of Absence Information

Please read the information below which is a reminder that holidays will not be authorised during term time and a leave of absence only agreed in exceptional circumstances.

'Parents do not have any entitlement to take their children on holiday during term time. Any application for leave must establish that there are exceptional circumstances and the Headteacher must be satisfied that the circumstances warrant the granting of leave. Headteachers will determine how many school days a child may be absent from school if the leave is granted.'

School Uniform Reminder

School uniform is an important part of the identity of our school and is linked to our ethos and values, particularly one of equality and contributes to the behaviours and attitudes we want to see across our school. We do not expect children to wear uniform with our school logo, that is a personal choice. However, we do ask that your children wear our school colours of red tops / white polo shirts and grey/black trousers/ skirts and wear comfortable and practical school shoes. Children should not wear nail varnish and if they have long hair, it should be tied back. Pupils are only permitted to wear small stud earrings and smart watches are not permitted in school.
