PE, Games and Forest School

P.E. – will take place every Tuesday. Children should come into school wearing their P.E. kit.

Games – will take place every Friday. Children should come into school wearing their school uniform and bring their P.E. kit to change into. *Please note, games lessons take place outside. It is important that children are able to change back into their clean uniform once the lesson is complete.*

Forest school – will take place every Wednesday. Children should come into school wearing their school uniform and bring their forest school kit with them. This should include wellies (or suitable outdoor shoes), long trousers, a long sleeve top and waterproofs. Gloves, scarves and hats will be required during the colder winter weather. *Please remember that Forest School will take place in all weather conditions. Please ensure children bring their full forest school kit each week as weather conditions can change quickly during the day.*

Homework

Homework will include:

- **Reading:** children should record their reading daily and record reading with an adult at least 3 times per week.
- **Spelling:** complete one activity each week. There are suggested activities at the front of the spelling homework books.
- **Maths:** complete one test page each week
- **Times Table Practise:** daily practice on TTRS

Homework will be set on Monday and is due in the following Monday. Please ensure children have their homework in their book bags on a Monday morning.

Children will record the homework that has been set each week in their homework diaries. They will also make a note of any other important messages or events for that coming week.

Please sign your child's homework diary every week. You are welcome to leave comments or record messages in your child's homework diary.

How you can support

There are many ways you can help to ensure your child has a successful term, including:

- Ensure children arrive on time; children should be settled at their tables and ready to learn by 08:55am
- Make sure your child knows where they are going at the end of the day
- Inform the school office before 9.00am if you child will be absent from school
- Send your children to school with a water bottle (please send bottles with a sports cap) and a fruit snack for break time
- Support and encourage your child to complete their homework; check homework has been completed and is handed in on time
- Sign their homework diaries every week
- Make sure children bring their maths and spelling homework with them every Monday
- Reading records/homework diaries should be sent into school every day
- Read with your child at least 3 times per week; record this reading in their reading records
- Discuss Picture News at home

Please note: School attendance is vital in ensuring your child feels settled in school and able to achieve their full potential. Children are expected to attend school every day unless there is an illness that prevents them from attending or exceptional circumstances that have been discussed and agreed with the head teacher.
